



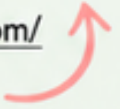

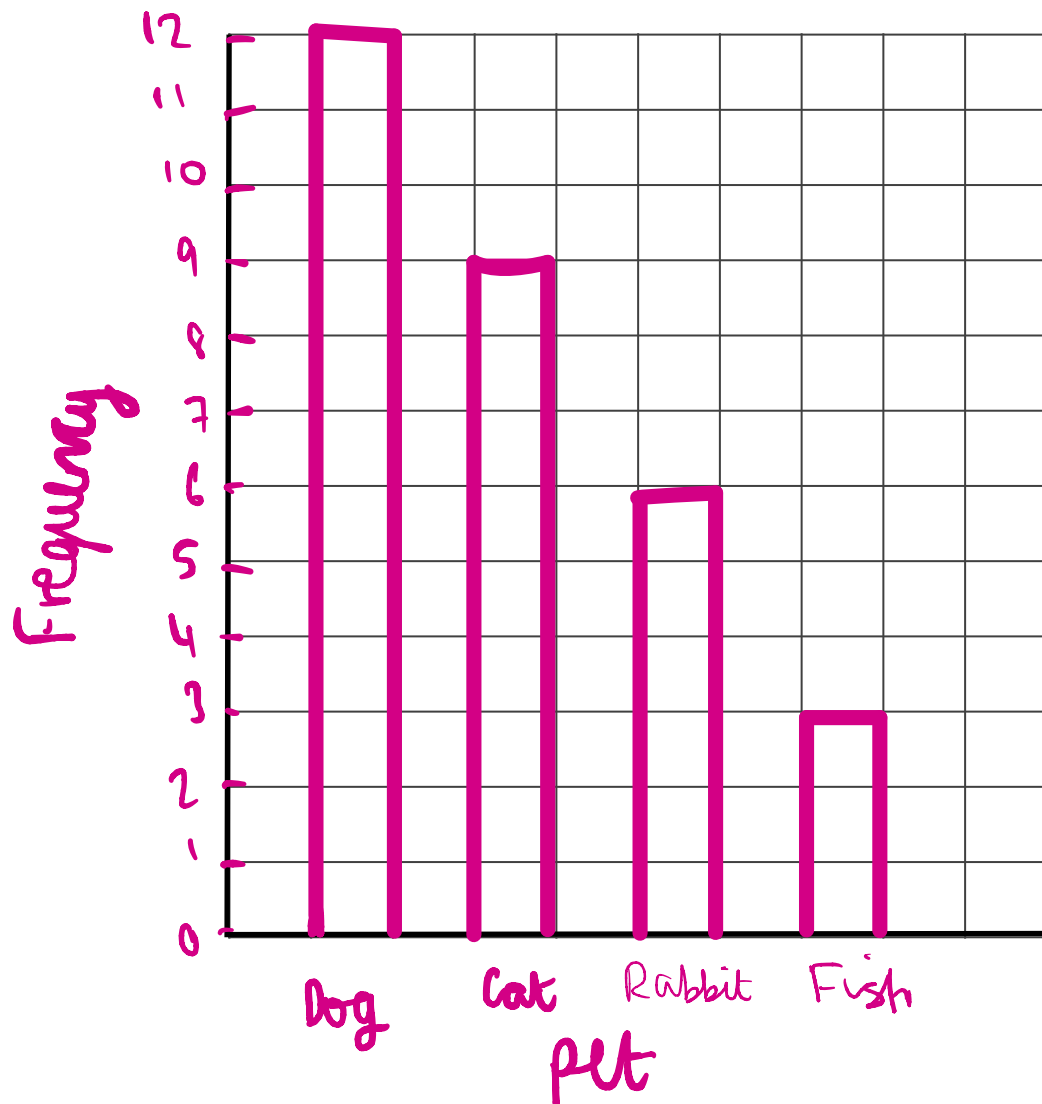

Draw a bar chart for this information.

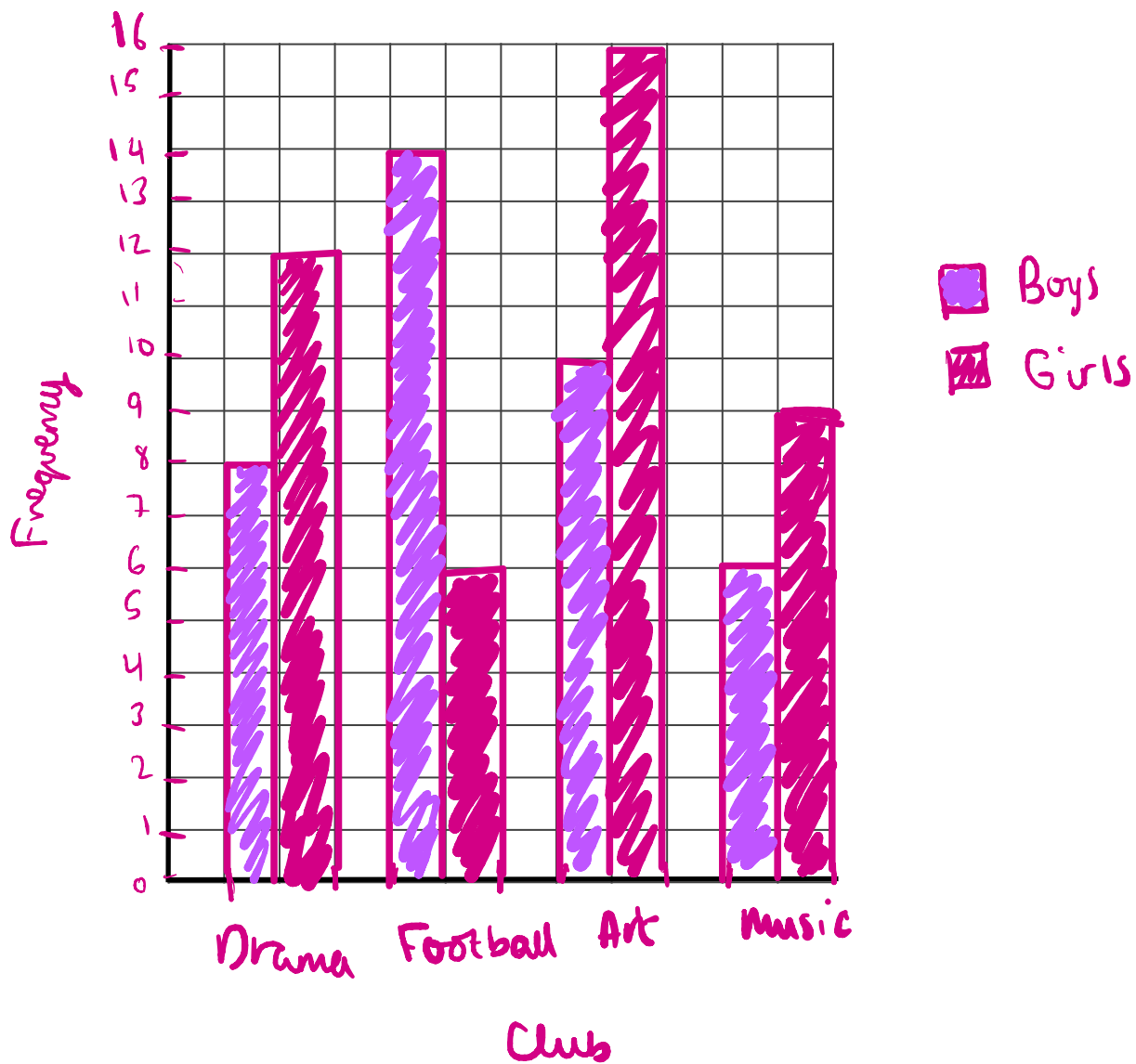

2. The table shows the number of boys and girls who chose each after-school club.

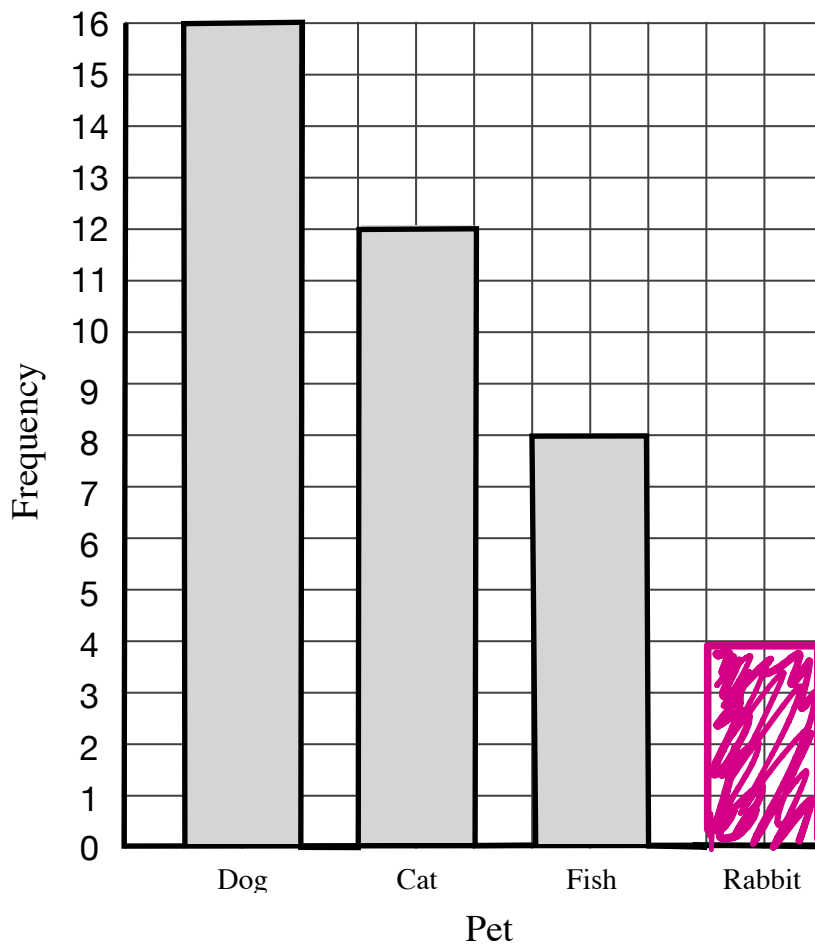
Club	Boys	Girls

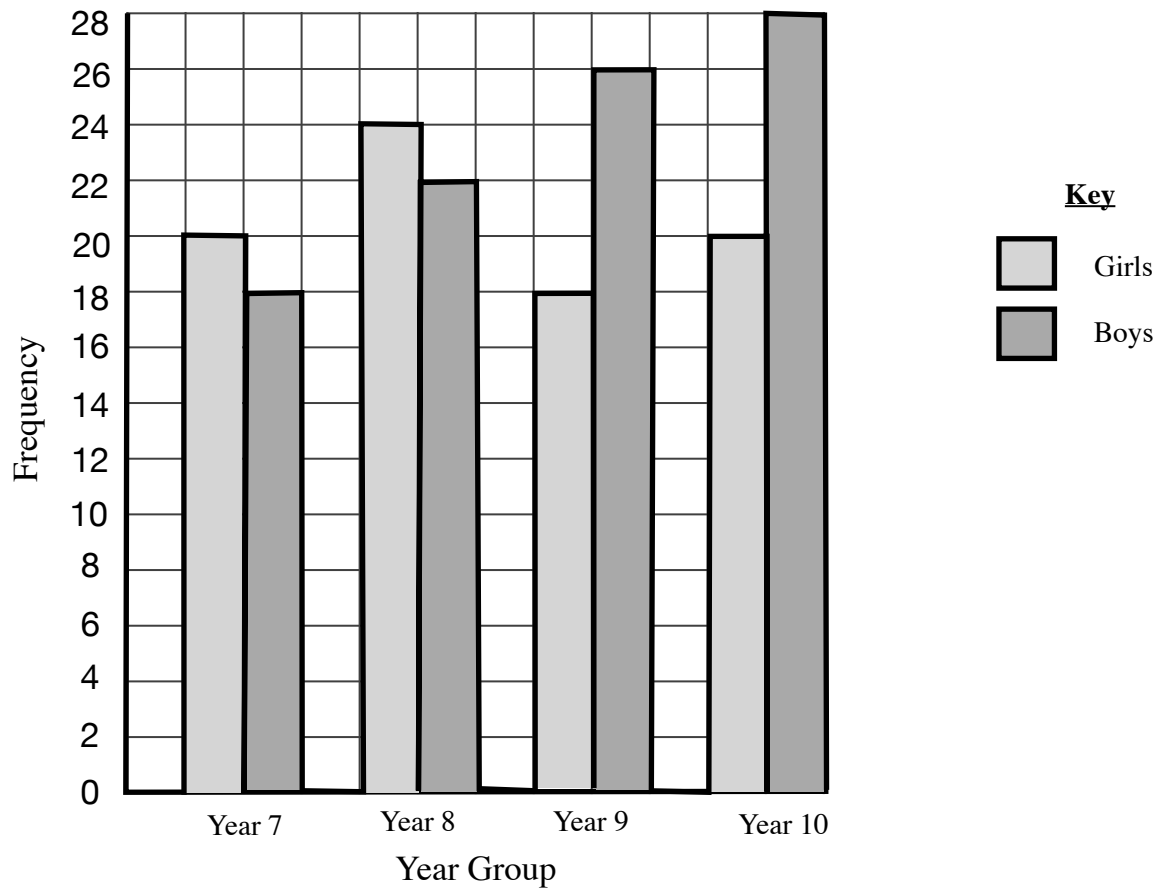

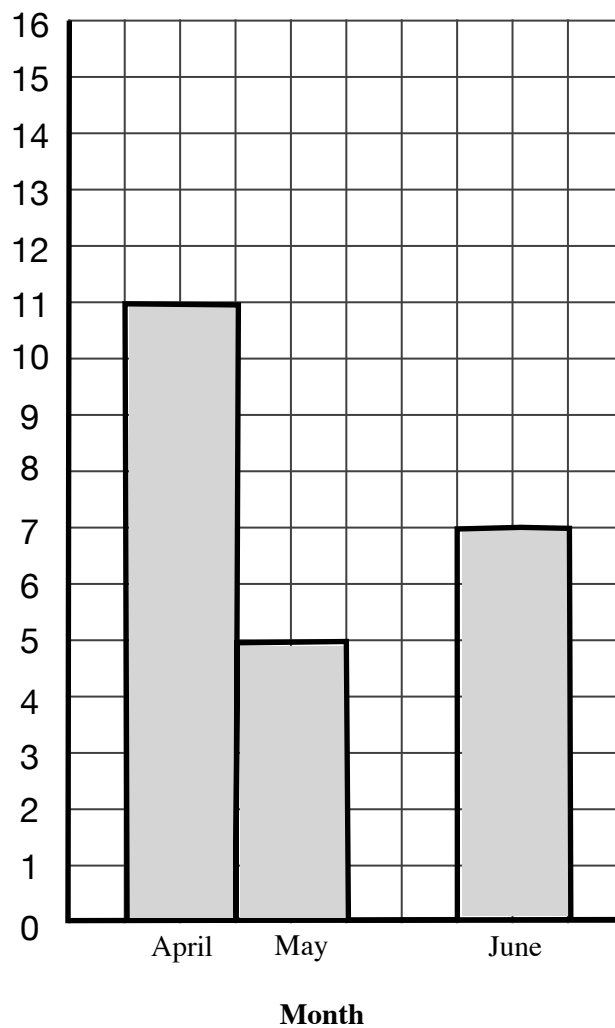
